From Your President

To do that, it feels right to describe the particular place where I've sought words that will connect with myself, in hopes that they will connect with you.

Please join me on my 'Parsons' chair, purchased soon after we arrived from Seattle in 2016. Upholstered in a soft, dull gold and

enlivened with embroidered vines in a brighter shade, the chair nestles in one corner of the room. At left, a sturdy old oak bookcase that yet resonates with impermanence—recalling a friendship broken after a 30-year run. Perhaps choosing this case for my books on Buddhism was an act of acceptance, perhaps placing a small Matisse print, "The Joy of Life," above the case was a gesture of hope and healing.

Along the wall across from me, a twin bed displays two of my late grandmother's lovely handcut linen tablecloths. Though stains prevented me from using them as intended, by overlapping them to hide the spots I created a bedspread! Atop the spread, leaning against the wall, a Tiepolo print exudes the mysterious beauty of Italian light. Lastly, enlivening the little dresser of my late father-in-law, Kenneth Read, is "Beethoven's Piano," made by our own Stella Shufford at age six. Its construction-paper keyboard dances on a red background lightly sprinkled with glitter. While Kenneth completed a career as a noted anthropologist, little Stella's piece, for me, mingles the energy of youth, potential, and the yet to become.

May these few moments spent in the quiet precincts of my mind inspire you to commune with the familiar objects of your own settings. May your solitude refresh and delight you with the sense of belonging in this world with all its strangeness, vulnerability, and beauty. I wish you the joy of sharing your discoveries!

the Right to Clean Water

We Need this Amendment!

UU Justice Florida supports the proposed Amendment to the Florida Constitution, establishing the Right to Clean and Healthy Water.

When 80% of our springs are contaminated by excessive nitrogen, 9,000 miles of our estuaries, streams and rivers are contaminated with fecal bacteria, and when bluegreen algae blooms are becoming the "new normal," linked to neurodegenerative diseases, it is clear that litigation is not working. The laws have become "permits to pollute."

This citizens' initiative is the only way forward for our peninsula to continue to function with good water quality and quantity. Those who know call this a "911 issue."

According to environmental attorney Jane West, "Litigation isn't working. Lobbying isn't working. My personal opinion is that this is the only way forward. Without meaningful action on this amendment, I don't see how the peninsula is going to continue to function with good water quality and quantity moving forward."
